Headteacher's Update

As I come to the end of my first year of headship I find myself with the lovely task of reflecting back on all that has gone, by looking at the Newsletter comments and photos, whilst planning ahead for all that is still to come and learning from what hasn't gone quite to plan!

During this year, as a school, we have certainly experienced the whole gamut of emotions from happiness and excitement, much evidenced on the pages of this newsletter, to shared pride in the achievements of all who attend Brookfields School. As a school community we have also experienced sorrow and grief as we have said goodbye to Kathryn, who sadly lost her battle with cancer. However, I have found that at these times of high emotion, both joy and grief, the school community has come together to support each other and has grown through the experience. Individually and collectively, families, staff and our students have found ways to celebrate and remember the good times. We end the year stronger than we started it because of everything we have experienced.

Challenges this year have included the subsiding buildings in Key Stage 3. The pupils also enjoyed exploring different senses that they might experience at the beach such as: the feeling of the sand between their toes, the breeze of the sea against their face and the feel of the water through their fingertips.













Our Stay and Play session was enjoyed by all and was based around our water theme. We invited our parents and carers in to learn and play with us. We washed cars in the car wash, blew bubbles as we painted and searched for fish within blocks of ice.

Primary Adventurers

Black Class has been enjoying working on this term's theme "Sea Surf Sail". This term the class has started Explore Art allowing them to explore different stations based on the theme, such as sand and messy trays, paint with stencils, and collage stations, all using summer themed colours. Additionally, the pupils have enjoyed their immersive story telling sessions of "Walking in the Jungle" both in the Drama Studio and in The Library! They enjoyed exploring the different resources and singing different songs, including a welcome song that incorporated a hello in a variety of languages! As the sun is officially out, the pupils have been enjoying more time outside with water play, walks on the daily mile track, and of course their weekly swimming sessions!









Class have continued exploring our theme of 'Surf, Sea and Sail', focusing on sea creatures and pirate stories. The children have been practising their phonics and reading, making incredible progress, as well as developing their numeracy skills with a focus addition, particular on repeating patterns and learning about money. We have also regularly enjoyed playing games together to develop our communication and social skills, and build friendships and positive relationships different adults.







Pink Class have really enjoyed our topic 'Surf, Sea and Sail' this term. Pupils have explored pirate themed resources to go with their story 'Pirate Pete and his Smelly Feet'. The children have branched out to different areas of the school such as the Forest School and the Drama Studio, and made sure to stay cool and hydrated in the hot weather! The term has been bookmarked by a brilliant Sports Day! Well done Pink Class, time for a well-earned rest!











Over the summer term, **White Class** have enjoyed their topic of 'Surf, Sea and Sail'. Within this topic the pupils have looked at different countries around the world, considering their leader/ruler, the currency, local foods, drinks and the climate of each country. White Class have loved using the computers to complete Kahoot quizzes – with questions based on our learning from the week before. The children have also learnt about Pirates, what ships they used, what food and drink they had aboard their ships, creating our own treasure maps and ships from junk modelling materials. During Music sessions,

pupils have focused on Sea Shanties, and the class were able to create their own lyrics to the tune of the 'Wellerman Shanty'. White Class loved learning the sign language for some pirate words! This half term we have focused on Rock Pools, looking at the different creatures within a rock pool, where we find rock pools and making their own rock pool creatures from clay. A big highlight for White Class was Sports Day – they were all able to take part and cheer each other

on – it was a lovely team atmosphere.







Our **Nurture Base** students access a separate provision to the normal school offer, focusing on the 6 Principles of Nurture to help develop social, emotional and behavioural skills. This term, we have been out and about as a group accessing things in our local community. It has been great to celebrate how safe we can be together, and the progress we have made in the past year. The group have been for a walk to the local shop and playing field.



The Nurture Base pupils also went on a school trip to the Select Car Leasing Stadium, home of Reading Football Club.



We are so proud of how the pupils are recognising their own emotions even when they are overwhelmed and how they are using appropriate tools to regulate.



Madejski Class It's been another happy and creative term in Madejski class. We have so much to celebrate! Our topic 'Heroes and Legends' has provided opportunities to explore the fascinating legend of Robin Hood. We have investigated his life, where he lived and how he survived in Sherwood Forest. We transformed our classroom into a forest, developed our outside learning area and made a lifesize Robin Hood scarecrow, archery target and rustic scenery. Pupils have developed their communication skills through storytelling, role play and drama. It has been such a rich topic. We've also maximised opportunities to go off-site to the local woods and to the woodland trails at Basildon Park, investigating the natural environment. We have learnt about all things Medieval – even making Maid Marian's currant pie. We also honed our archery skills in PE, just like Robin Hood and his merry men! Through cross-curricular links pupils have brought Robin Hood to life.











During the second half of the term, Madejski Class have moved on to the legend of King Arthur. This has provided opportunities to investigate the Dark Ages and castles, knights and weaponry through the story 'The Sword and the Stone'. 

We want to take this opportunity to say a huge well done to the pupils in Winslet Class this year for all their hard work.



Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award Update July 2023

This year has been an exciting year for Brookfields' Duke of Edinburgh participants. It is the first time that Brookfields students have attempted the Silver level award. The Silver Award requires participants to complete four different sections. These are Volunteering, Physical, Skills and an Expedition. It can take up to 12 months to complete all four sections and demands a weekly commitment from students to attend activities in and out of school. This year's participants have enjoyed activities as varied as rugby training, musical instruments (trombone, drumming, guitar and keyboard lessons across the group), volunteering at local youth groups and ParkRun as well as Scuba Diving.

Having committed to and completed these sections individually, they are also required to complete two expeditions. These are team expeditions over 3 days and 2 nights where participants plan, navigate and camp with minimal support. They cook their own food and plan their own routes and cope with weather, fatigue **and** each other!! The 3 days requires energy, resilience, team work and determination and this was evident in abundance as they all worked through their assessment.



Maths News

We celebrated National Numeracy Day (17th May 2023) at the end of last term. There were various games and activities including archery which enabled pupils to use all their mathematical knowledge in a practical way.

The "feely boxes" full of interesting challenges hidden in slime, jelly and goodness knows what else were particularly fun!

We have been so lucky with the weather this term which has enabled us to get out and enjoy lots more mathematical challenges outside.









Throughout the school there has been a huge variety of cognition activities taking place such as sequencing using the Waldon technique, learning about capacity through asking for "more", indicating "too much" and playing with sand and water containers, using symbols to sort and match, exploring cause and effect.













Madejski class have also enjoyed exploring the capacity of water containers in the very hot weather, organising a water carrying challenge and measuring how much water each team successfully got in the bucket!

Fletcher and Purple Classes have been practising their counting, ordering and shape skills through all sorts of games outside, inside and on the smartboard and all learning to take their turn fairly.



Pupils in Sky class have been working with money this term. They practised counting, recognising coins and ordering them by value.

Key Stage 3 had great fun during their Cross Curricular Week – exploring gardening and cooking and applying some of their mathematical skills in different contexts through pattern making, measuring and following instructions in sequence.












Sutton students have been exploring multiplication and division through grouping and sharing activities. They are also beginning to look at how bus timetables work and how understanding this helps to plan a journey.



Literacy and News from The Library


At the start of this term, we started our immersive storytelling project. Pupils have gone on a journey to the jungle to discover the animals who are hiding in the rivers and trees. The story is told with a mixture of music and sensory exploration. The bananas from the monkeys have proved very popular.





Classes joined us for the story over five weeks and after each session they have an activity which they can take back to class. These activities have included making face masks of the animals in the story, learning the Makaton signs for each animal and using pictures to remember the sequence of the story. 
